hich member of Congress will introduce the What's Good for Congress is Great for the America People Act?

In his 2014 book Unstoppable: The Emerging Left-Right Alliance to Dismantle the Corporate State (Nation Books, 2014), Ralph Nader argues that a populist left-right coalition to free Congress from corporate control would be unstoppable, but to move toward convergence, it is first necessary to separate the corporatists from the principled conservatives.

If you can get past the corporate controlled leadership of both parties and the White House, the proposals outlined in Unstoppable would have a better than even chance of

"Since the publication of Unstoppable, and listening to and reading about the possibilities of right left convergence, I've come to focus on two simple bills that if enacted would go a long way toward making members of Congress identify with their sovereign voters, to be more part of 'we the people' instead of 'we the corporate Congress," Nader says.

Bill one: Congress members will have no employment benefits that are not accorded to all American workers, including pensions, health insurance and deductible expenses. As for wage ratios, members will be paid no more than ten times the federal minimum wage. (If • Continued on Page 4 **SLAUGHTERHOUSE**
