

Pelosi: Calling for a ceasefire in Gaza is Putin's message

Dana Bash: One of the challenges that Democrats might have in organizing is some anger in some corners of the progressive movement over Joe Biden's support for Israel in its war against Hamas terrorists.

How concerned are you – especially given the fact that we have seen protesters over and over at his events – how concerned are you that people, young people, Arab Americans, progressives – I'm not suggesting that they're going to go vote for Donald Trump, but how concerned are you that they might just stay home?

NANCY PELOSI: Well, let me just say this, because I have been the recipient of their, shall we say, exuberances, and it's as recently as in Seattle on Thursday, unfortunately wanted to disrupt our very exciting Democratic meeting there.

They're in front of my house all the time. So I have a feeling for what feelings they have. But we have to think about what we're doing. And what we have to do is try to stop the suffering in Gaza. This is women and children. People don't have a place to go. So let's address that.

But for them to call for a cease-fire is Mr. Putin's message, Mr. Putin's message. Make no mistake, this is directly connected to what he would like to see. Same thing with Ukraine. It's about Putin's message. I think some of these – some of these protesters are spontaneous and organic and sincere.

Some, I think, are connected to Russia. And I say that having looked at this for a long time now, as you know.
