"Trump can save America or have another war, but he can't do both"

onald Trump's victorious 2024 Presidential campaign was fueled by hundreds of millions of dollars in donations from the corporatists, but he arguably narrowly won the election by appealing to MAGA's populist base.

In November, for example, Trump won a key swing district – Saginaw County – in a swing state – Michigan – because of these populists – who firmly believe that this time, Trump will drain the swamp. And this time around, they explicitly called out the swamp dwellers – the giant corporations that control their lives.

Earlier this year, Lori Patterson, chair of the Saginaw Republican party, told the *Guardian* newspaper that she believes that Trump will take on the corporate giants she said wield too much control over U.S. politics and citizens' lives.

"The industrial complex, they're enriching themselves, and it's supposed to be about the people," Patterson said. "Trump made mistakes in his first term. He wasn't a politician. He didn't know how to really drain that swamp like he wanted to. He trusted some of the wrong people. He learned that lesson this time."


She said that Robert F. Kennedy Jr., whose nomination to be Secretary of Health and Human Services came under heavy attack by food and pharmaceutical corporate giants, "is going to expose the chemicals that are in our foods."

"It's terrible that our foods here in the United States are so different than like of those in the UK. Why are our ingredients so different?" Patterson said.

"The problem is when they're putting that stuff in our foods, they're making us more unhealthy which is, in turn, helping big pharma because pharma is making profit off of us being unhealthy. RFK wants to put a stop to this."

In Washington, Trump's populist camp is filled with the likes of Darren Beattie, who was appointed in early February to oversee public diplomacy at the State Department.

"It's hard to overstate what a significant signal his appoint-

ment is," Ryan Grim wrote when he heard the news of Beattie's appointment. "Beattie – a former speech writer who Semafor described as a MAGA intellectual – is an outspoken critic of the warhawk wing of the GOP and his ascension has sent shockwaves through Washington's neocon think-tank universe."

"His appointment is as radical as a Democratic president sending Noam Chomsky to run the CIA, though let's be clear, we are not witnessing a revival of a new socialist international," Grim wrote. "Trump's realists are rooted firmly in a right-wing tradition. Beattie, who was fired from the first administration for speaking at a conference alongside white nationalists, said as recently as October 2024 – 'Competent white men must be in charge if you want things to work. Unfortunately, our entire

Next lab leak could kill hundreds of millions

'Purposely creating ever more dangerous viruses is insanity'

hat technology has the potential to kill more than half of the human population – four to five billion children, women and men – in a short time, thereby ending civilization as we know it?

The first answer that might come to mind is a thermo-nuclear war. That would be apocalyptic, of course, with no assurance that humans or the earth's other life communities would survive.

But there is another equally catastrophic threat to humanity; one that is much more likely to occur, yet unknown to much of the world's population. This threat is based primarily on the development of genetic engineering and synthetic biology techniques that allow researchers to create new viruses and to make current viruses more transmissible, virulent, and lethal.

These experiments include enhancing the infectivity and deadliness of the most dangerous potentially pandemic viruses on earth. The accidental or intentional release of novel engineered viruses could lead to numerous devastating pan-
